Musings from Your Minister:

If We Use It: Theme-Based Ministry

This coming year, we are doing an experi-learn throughout the whole congregation: theme-based ministry.

After careful consideration, we have bought membership in Touchstones theme-based ministry – a UU resource that will help us cultivate possibilities, respond to some of our congregational dilemmas, and deepen our spiritual maturity. While last year we attempted a form of theme-based ministry, it was a pale imitation of what is possible.

This year, with the support and technical assistance of Touchstones, we will have access to:

- resources to help shape Sunday morning services, both with words and for music selection;
- focused content for religious education for children and youth that our RE program will review and use to augment their curricula;
- a monthly journal available to all who subscribe to the TUS email blasts, so that you can be inspired on your own; and
- the possibility for folks who want to go deeper spiritually as part of monthly small covenant groups.

In theme-based ministry, people of all ages explore common themes in age-appropriate ways and on multiple levels, thus providing a possible bridge to some of these distances...if we use it. It extends congregational presence beyond Sunday morning, and quite possibly into the realm of social media: continuing the conversation on the car ride (great for families) or over the dinner table, or online...if we use it. It's accessible on many levels, at all ages, for whomever would like to go deeper...if we use it. It helps increase common points of reference that can spur new conversations, create synergy, deepen shared identity, and spark creativity...if we use it. It can help each of us individually, and all of us as a community, to embrace a practical theology that we use in our everyday lives...if we use it.

For 2017-18, Touchstones has an overarching theme: Reimagining the Common Good. Monthly themes are:
